# WHEN I TURNED 16, INSTEAD OF BUYING A CAR, I BOUGHT A TRACTOR



Mike Jasper has had what he calls the "farming bug" for almost as long as he can remember. His grandfather was a farmer, and one day he took an 8 year-old Mike out into the fields with him on his tractor. "Right then, I was hooked," he says.

Mike began his career in earnest less than a decade later in 1980, when friends of his grandmother rented him 25 acres to farm corn and soybeans in Sawyer. "They took a chance on a 17 year-old kid," he says. "When I turned 16, instead of buying a car, I beneficial pollinators like bees and bought a tractor."

Today, Mike farms more than 800 acres in southern Berrien County, growing corn, soybeans and grapes. Last year, he worked with Chikaming Open Lands to place a conservation easement on approximately 74 acres of his land. The easement extinguishes the development rights on the property and preserves this prime farmland for agricultural use in perpetuity.

Chikaming Open Lands received a federal grant which covered half of the acquisition cost, while the remainder was funded in part by a donation from Mike in the form of a price reduction, and in part by funds previously raised for land acquisitions from

a combination of individual donors and The Pokagon Fund.

Preserving agricultural land is as important as protecting woodland, prairie, and other natural areas. This is particularly true in this corner of Southwest Michigan, which is home to a unique microclimate that provides optimal conditions for growing fruits and vegetables. As a result, agriculture is a vital part of the economy here. Farmland also provides habitat for wildlife, including butterflies. And in this region, farms often include valuable wetlands that help control flooding and filter stormwater, improving water quality. Plus, protecting farmland helps preserve the rural character and scenic landscapes that define our community.

Mike's reasons for preserving his agricultural lands are quite simple. "This land is too good to put houses on," he says. He's also thinking of the future: his son caught that farming bug too, at just about the same age Mike did, when he started showing animals at the Berrien County Youth Fair. Now 13, he's told his dad he wants to farm too. "I want to be sure [this] land is available for him to do that."

483 people attended our outreach events, including guided hikes, paddles, environmental film screenings, and educational seminars.



# WHEN THE KIDS GIVE BACK TO THE LAND IN THIS WAY, THEY DEVELOP A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY FOR IT.



It was a delight to see the big yellow school bus full of fifth graders trundle down East Road to meet us at Robinson Woods Preserve for our second year of Mighty Acorns field studies this fall. We'd met most of these children as fourth graders during our first year running this environmental education program and we were excited to have them back here. They were excited too. "I can't WAIT to get back into the woods!" exclaimed one boy as he came off the bus.

But perhaps we should let Ava, a student in Sherrie Bender's fifth grade class at River Valley Elementary School, tell her version of their return to Robinson Woods. After their outing this past fall, Sherrie had her students write stories about the field study, from the perspective of a plant or animal that makes the preserve its home. Ava wrote hers from the point of view of an American beech treehere's an excerpt:

"It was an incredible day at Robinson Woods. All the beautiful birds were chirping. Suddenly a yellow spaceship drove up with all these little two footed monsters! They were talking to these older monsters. I was wondering what they were talking about. Could they be talking

about me? I had the urge to go up there, but I'm a tree so how am I supposed to move?

The little monsters started walking, the older split them up into three groups. The first group I saw were picking up the invasive plants. I was so glad they were doing that for Robinson Woods. It made me so happy!!!!"

Sherrie says that this creative writing exercise helps the students reflect on their field study, and look at what they saw and learned differently. "They're looking at nature from nature's point of view," she says. "It also gets them thinking about human impact on the environment."

We love to see the Mighty Acorns kids grow more and more engaged with nature and knowledgeable about their local ecosystems. "Their science lessons are much more meaningful when they learn in the field," says Sherrie. Best of all, the students' stewardship work creates a connection to the land they are caring for. "When the kids give back to the land in this way, they develop a sense of responsibility for it," she says. "You can tell that they feel like it's 'their place', in a way." And it's that connection to the land that helps ensure a bright future for conservation in our community.

One accomplishment that spans beyond last year is the growing number of properties your generosity has helped Chikaming Open Lands protect and


